<u>World Youth Day</u> Joining in prayer with young people from around the world, meeting today with the Holy Father in Lisbon to celebrate World Youth Day, we pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit on each one of them, that the Gospel message of joy and peace may be proclaimed afresh to our world.

At this time, we remember the devastation caused in **Hiroshima and Nagasaki** when the atomic bombs were dropped, on 6th and 9th August 1945, and we pray that nuclear weapons will be abolished so that they can never be used again. In his message, 'A Culture of Care as a Path to Peace', Pope Francis asks, 'How many resources are spent on weaponry, especially nuclear weapons, that could be used for more significant priorities such as ensuring the safety of individuals, the promotion of peace and integral human development, the fight against poverty, and the provision of health care'. In this country, we have an active Catholic peace movement in Pax Christi.
